

Coteau Grove Farms is a breeder of high-quality thoroughbred racehorses located on 400 acres of rolling hills in Sunset, Louisiana.



The Myers have a love of horses and established their thoroughbred breeding operation when they purchased eight broodmares at the Keenland sale in November of 2008. Their objective was to become a top- quality breeder of Louisiana bred racehorses capable of being competitive in nationally in open company.


The Myers' strategy for Coteau Grove Farms was to first build their brand through racing while selectively culling and acquiring mares to build a high- quality broodmare band. After a decade of success on the track and following their long term strategy, the Myers' began yearlings at top national thoroughbred sales venues.

Family is of the utmost importance to Keith and Ginger Myers. Everyone in the family is involved with Coteau Grove Farms on some level.






















THE HISTORY BEHIND THE NAME



How Coteau Grove Farms got its name. Coteau Ridge. That's the secret to the soil.

Grand Coteau is situated on what was (2,000 years ago) the west bank of the Mississippi and now listed in the National Register of Historic Places. It is a sloping ridge (coteau). Magnificent live oaks and trees form alleys, groves, and gardens.

GRAND COTEAU

The tiny village of Grand Coteau ("Big Hill") may be the most serene place in south Louisiana. Nestled against a sweeping ridge that formed a natural levee of the Mississippi River centuries ago, the town is oriented around a core of grand and beautiful religious institutions. Covering the hill itself is a peaceful cemetery, behind the stately St. Charles College, a Jesuit seminary. When the Mississippi overflowed its banks during the cataclysmic flood of 1927, the water stopped at the base of Grand Coteau's ridge, and the town was preserved. Today the entire town center is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The land that Coteau Grove Farms calls home is all of these and the name reflects this culture, history, and tradition that the Myers family cherishes. Generations have farmed in rural communities and the Myers family remains close to its roots.





THE COTEAU GROVE FARMS CULTURE



Coteau Grove Farms in Sunset, Louisiana is committed to raising the standards in Louisiana at its family estate.

Animals and horse racing are in their blood. Keith's grandfather was Alphonse Fontenot, who bred and raced quarter horses in the 1950's and 1960's. The barn was in the backyard where Keith mucked stalls, fed and watered the horses when visiting his grandparents. Not allowed to enter the track as a 10-year-old, Keith remembers watching the night racing at Evangeline Downs through a fence sitting in the bed of his grandfather's pick-up truck in the parking lot.


Among the diverse ways that Keith's father earned a livelihood was raising and selling crawfish to local residents from a pond on the farm. True to entrepreneurial form, his son Keith saw bigger opportunities and dove into his typical research mode.

He talked his father into investing in a processing plant that would ultimately become Louisiana Premium Seafood exporting processed Louisiana crawfish to major suppliers in the United States and Europe.

In line with the tradition of southwest Louisiana horsemen is the fact that both Keith and Ginger grew up on rural farms in North St. Landry Parish. "You sat on the porch and counted the trees," Ginger recalled of a life less complicated. The two met one afternoon when Ginger accompanied her mother to a hair curling appointment. Keith was 14 years old at the time and remembers being smitten.

The Myers are committed to continuous improvement as they continue invest in raising the bar of quality at Coteau Grove Farms.

FACILITIES AND LAND



Coteau Grove Farms sits on 400 acres in Sunset, Louisiana. Lush pastures proved a great environment for their broodmares, their foals, and their young horses as they prepare for racing careers. Their pastures have turnout sheds for shade and shelter from inclement weather.


Two barns with 22 stalls, including foaling stalls, provide stabling for their broodmares, foals, and young horses. State-of-the-art video monitoring systems allow us to keep an eye on their horses, while giving them a chance to rest without interruption. This is especially important during foaling season.

At every turn, the spaciousness and quality presentation at Coteau Grove Farms is breathtaking. Paddocks the size of soccer fields with fence design that flows freestyle with the contour of the rolling hills provides the touch and feel of a world class horse farm.




"There are certain disciplines that have to be maintained. We really set the bar high and keep it there. Our goals are to raise horses that can compete in open company on a national level."

Horse Sales Success at Saratoga

Coteau Grove Farms also sold the mare, Kara's Match Point, for \$450,000 at Keeneland November 2016. Her foal sold right after her for \$230,000.

Black Chocolate is a strong, powerfully built daughter of leading sire Harlan's Holiday (also the sire of the dominant sire Into Mischief). She was purchased for \$160,000 (in-foal to City of Light) at Keeneland November 2019. She has already produced a top-level horse, the Grade 1 placed sprinter Mr. Crow, who earned \$348,963 and was second in the Vosburgh S. (G1) at Belmont. Black Chocolate had a colt by the red-hot young sire City of Light in 2020 that sold for \$250,000 at the 2021 Saratoga Yearling Sale. The goal in breeding her to more classic types is so that her progeny can stretch out around two turns.




Success at the Racetrack

Louisiana Horse of the Year and Champion Three-Year Old

A \$75,000 purchase by Maggi Moss, No Parole crushed his competition at the start of his career, winning three Louisiana-bred events, including a stake, by a combined 34 lengths. Extended to two turns for last year's GII Rebel S., the bay proved to be distance-limited, finishing eighth, but bounced back with a pair of victories, including the GI Woody Stephens S. last June. Off the board in his next two starts in graded company, No Parole kicked off 2021 with a facile victory in the LA-Bred Premier Sprint S. Feb. 10.

"He was the first Grade I winner we bred. It is so exciting," Myers said. "We watch him very, very closely and when he is finished on the track, we will certainly be interested in where he goes next [as a stallion]."

With representatives like The Great One and No Parole on the racetrack and an influx of new bloodlines from the November Sales, the Myers will have the racing world giving Louisiana-breds a much harder look in the future.

To Parole who began the year with the thirteen plus length victory at Fair Grounds in January was an easy winner in his division this year. This win was followed by a trip to Delta Downs to easily capture the Louisiana Premier Night Prince Stakes by six and a half lengths. A nice allowance win at Oaklawn Park set him up nicely for his venture to the big time.

In June he led every step in the \$250,000 Grade I Woody Stevens Stakes at Belmont Park.

For the year No Parole had four victories from seven starts with earnings of \$270,866 which is the most any Louisiana bred earned in 2020.

No Parole was purchased as a yearling by Maggie Moss for \$75,000 from the consignment of Select Sales as agent for Coteau Grove Farms at the Keeneland Yearling Sale, an interest in him was sold to Greg Tramontin during the year.

Bred by Keith and Ginger Myers' Coteau Grove Farms, No Parole is the first stakes winner pro-

SUCCESS AT THE RACETRACK

Violence Colt Takes No Prisoners in Woody Stephens

ELMONT, NY — 'TDN Rising Star' No Parole (Violence) exited his rail draw with his mind on business, and ran four quality rivals off their feet to collect a first toplevel score in Saturday's GI Woody Stephens S. at Belmont Park.

The Louisiana-bred cruised on the front end through an opening quarter in :22.31 with slightly favored 'Rising Star' Meru (Sky Mesa) and GIII Gotham S. winner Mischevious Alex (Into Mischief) giving chase in second and third. Mischevious Alex made his move into second and the turning- back 'TDN Rising Star' Shoplifted (Into Mischief) began to wind up with a flashy move from the back with a three-wide bid as they hit the quarter pole.

But No Parole was still going easy up front, however, and despite racing on his left lead down the stretch, reported home a dominating winner by 3 3/4 lengths.

Fellow 'Rising Star' and Bachelor S. runner-up Echo Town (Speightstown), racing a bit further back than expected in the early going perhaps, came along late after saving ground throughout to complete the exacta without threatening the winner.

Shoplifted, fifth in the Oaklawn S. going 1 1/8 miles last time Apr.



11, was third.

No Parole won his first three career starts, all against state-breds, by a combined margin of 34 lengths, including the La-Bred Premier Night Prince S. going a two-turn mile at Delta Downs

Feb. 8.

Little went right in his next attempt around two turns, however, facing open company for the first time in Oaklawn's GII Rebel S. Mar. 14. No Parole flashed early speed that day and tired badly to report home a distant last of eight in the sloppy going. He bounced back in style with a sharp optional claiming tally going six furlongs at Oaklawn last time Apr. 24.

"I think No Parole's game is his speed," winning trainer Tom Amoss said. "He's shown that in all his races. To be able to draw the inside and take advantage of that with a good rider like [Luis] Saez, everything played out as we hoped.

Amoss continued, "No Parole is a one-turn horse for sure. We'll get together with the ownership and we'll sit down and map out a plan. We're very excited about his future and we're already thinking about the first weekend in November [for the Breeders' Cup]."

Saez added, "He came out of the gate perfect and he put me in a perfect spot. We came to the half-mile and I had a lot of horse. When we hit the stretch, he took off. I was sitting chilly and I knew I had a lot of horse. When everyone got close to him [turning for home], he took off again."

Success at the Racetrack

Horses often hold a special place in
the hearts of their breeders. After
all, the breeder is almost like the
parent as they are the ones who
bring that horse to life and give
them their start in the world. But,
some horses are a little extra special
to their creators for one reason
or another and GII San Felipe S.
contender The Great One (Nyquist)
is one those for his breeders Keith
and Ginger Myers of Coteau Grove
Farms in Sunset, Louisiana.

In 2008, the Myers started their broodmare band with eight mares purchased at the Keeneland November Sale. The first of those eight to foal was a mare named Character Builder (Coronado's Quest), who they bought for \$65,000 in foal to El Corredor. The resulting foal, who was the first born on Coteau Grove Farms, was Little Ms Protocol, the dam of The Great One.

"In those first mares we bought in 2008, was a mare named Character Builder," Keith Myers said. "She had the first foal born on this farm, which was Little Ms Protocol, the dam of The Great One. My wife is a nurse and she is so passionate about the horses. They are all like children. She delivered Little Ms Protocol. We had a vet there as




well, but she did everything. She imprinted her and stayed the whole night with her. Little Ms Protocol had a great career in Louisiana as a racehorse before she went to be a broodmare. So, we had a personal attachment through that which makes The Great One even more special."

As they were brand new to the breeding business, the Myers raced all of their homebreds themselves at first to establish their brand in the state, which included Little Ms Protocol. The chestnut carried the Coteau Grove Farms colors to nine wins—seven of which were stakes—from 30 starts, all of which took place in Louisiana. She placed in 12 additional races for earnings of \$731,290.

"When we see him run, we see the determination and the competitiveness that Little Miss Protocol had," Myers said. "When she was neck and neck coming down the stretch, more than a few times, we have seen her reach forward and try to bite the horse next to her coming down the stretch. When I see how he comes on at the end, I see a lot of Little Miss Protocol in him. I am sure a lot of that is in our minds because we love Little Miss Protocol so much, but it makes it extra special for us."

A \$125,000 OBSOCT yearling buy, The Great One brought \$185,000 from Dennis O'Neill at the OBS June Sale, which was held in July last year, and sent to trainer Doug O'Neill. His connections thought highly enough of him to debut him in the grassy Speakeasy S. at Santa Anita in September, but he proved the turf was not for him, finishing sixth. Fourth to recent GIII Southwest S. runner-up Spielberg (Union Rags) next out going a mile on the Del Mar main track Nov. 1, he filled the same spot going a mile on the lawn there 28 days later. Second to Spielberg in the GII Los Alamitos Futurity S., The Great One dominated next out in a one-mile maiden special in Arcadia Jan. 23, graduating by 14 lengths.



➡ BREEDING PROGRAM

The Coteau Grove Farms breeding program takes advantage of the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association's lucrative breeding incentive programs. Mares are bred to top stallion standing in Louisiana and Kentucky on alternate years. Coteau Grove Farms is committed to improving the quality of thoroughbred horses in Louisiana.

Their team works primarily with Andrew Cary (Cary Bloodstock) as well as Werk Thoroughbred Consulting, to find top mares for the breeding program. Cary Bloodstock does the majority of the mare research, mating analysis and sales representation. With an ideal stallion match based on both conformation and bloodlines, this helps Coteau Grove Farms produce quality sales and racing prospects. In addition, the farm is set up to provide the best possible land for the development of young thoroughbreds.

Family is of the utmost importance to Keith and Ginger Myers. Everybody is involved on some level. The entire family helps to name every foal born on the farm.



The Myers were very busy at the November 2020 breeding stock sales, buying a substantial group of mares to improve their breeding program in the hopes of producing more Louisiana-breds of the same quality as No Parole and The Great One. They purchased 13 mares at Keeneland and two more at Fasig-Tipton through bloodstock agent Andrew Cary. Their purchases were topped by a trio of \$500,000 mares in Miss Hot Legs (Verrazano, a half-sister to champion Swiss Skydiver (Daredevil); the well-bred Contributing (Medaglia d' Oro), who was in foal to Speightstown; and Prado's Sweet Ride (Fort Prado, FTKNOV), who was carrying a foal by Justify.


